


Figure 1. Projects focused on children and green spaces in the participatory budgeting.




Figure 2. Projects focused on children and green spaces in relation to other projects submitted in the participatory budgeting.



Figure 3. The number of the jury's members with a given opinion regarding the provision of urban green spaces to children.




Figure 4. The categories of projects focused on green spaces submitted to participatory budgeting.




Figure 5. The share of votes cast by the different age categories in the total number of children's votes in the participatory budgeting (2018–2021).
